“Meth Houses & Meth Users in Indian Country”

Methamphetamine, also called meth, speed, chalk, ice, crystal, glass and even the seemingly innocent name of "Tina" is all around us. It is widespread in our native communities and is overburdening our medical centers, law enforcement, treatment centers, and other programs such as tribal housing, social services, etc. in their efforts to address, treat and clean up meth usage, production, and distribution. Gaining awareness and getting educated about meth assists in combating the problem.

This is a 2-part training and part 1 is to provide awareness and education on meth that has invaded our homes, workplaces, and communities. Part 2 will be on Meth Testing & Clean Up offered in spring of 2017, and participants will be tested and receive certification if successful.

Who should attend: Everyone, training is targeted for all who want to learn about meth. Tribal employees, board members and commissioners, tribal council members, law enforcement, social services, medical personnel, custodians, security, housekeepers, casino staff, bus drivers, maintenance, education staff, and other interested individuals should attend. Participants will receive training certificate and CEUs will be available.
